During the LCMC Three Days of Prayer event, each member of the First Lutheran Church congregation is invited and encouraged to dedicate time for prayer.

Our attitude toward prayer has often been characterized by saying, "well, all we can do now is pray!" Prayer is not the hopeless act of desperation. Prayer is a gift that God has given to us as a means to approach the throne of grace with confidence—like that of a child coming to her parents sharing concerns, victories, defeats and every part of life. It is an opportunity to express the deepest heartache and the greatest joy. Prayer is a conversation between the Creator and the created...and the conversation began with God, for us, in Christ Jesus.

The 2017 theme for FLC's Three Days of Prayer is "SEEK MY FACE."

"SEEK MY FACE" is a reference to Psalm 27:8 where the Psalmist wrote, "You have said, "Seek my face." My heart says to you, "Your face, Lord, do I seek." (as written in the ESV Bible Translation)

A brochure and additional prayer resources will be provided at Sunday morning worship on January 1st. **This year you will establish your own quiet time and place for prayer.** No special meetings or other prayer-day events are scheduled in the church. However, if you prefer to come to the church to pray, doors will be open throughout the day until about 5:30 in the evening.
