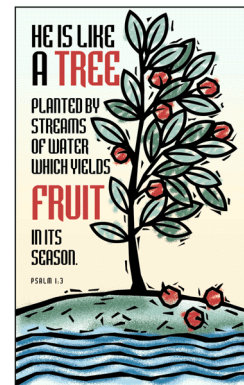


Growing up in Madagascar as a missionary kid meant attending a boarding school. Since this was a church related school, one of the things that happened as part of our everyday schedule was devotions and Bible Study. As part of our Bible Study we were asked to memorize Bible passages. I remember mem-

orizing many of the Psalms, some of which I still remember.

One of those Psalms was the first one.

- 1 Blessed is the man
 who walks not in the counsel of the wicked,
 nor stands in the way of sinners,
 nor sits in the seat of scoffers;
- 2 but his delight is in the law of the LORD,
 and on his law he meditates day and night.
- 3 He is like a tree
 planted by streams of water
 that yields its fruit in its season,
 and its leaf does not wither.
 In all that he does, he prospers.
- 4 The wicked are not so,
 but are like chaff that the wind drives away.
- 5 Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment,
 nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous;
- 6 for the LORD knows the way of the righteous,
 but the way of the wicked will perish.



This psalm encourages us to be rooted in God's word. That is where we draw our strength from. Like a tree draws moisture and nutrients from the ground for life, so we draw what we need for our faith from God's Word. God's word is where we hear about God's love for us and all the promises that God makes to us. The deeper we are rooted in God's word, the stronger our faith can become and the more "fruit" we can produce in our lives. The deeper we are rooted in God's word the less chance of us drying up and blowing away which is what happens to those who do not trust in God or in His word.

So, I encourage you and challenge you to go deep into God's word. Memorize some of the Psalms and other Bible passages. They will be of comfort and strength to you many times in your life as they have in mine.

A special offering will be taken after the worship service. Checks should be made out to "Food For The Poor". This is separate from your regular Sunday offering.

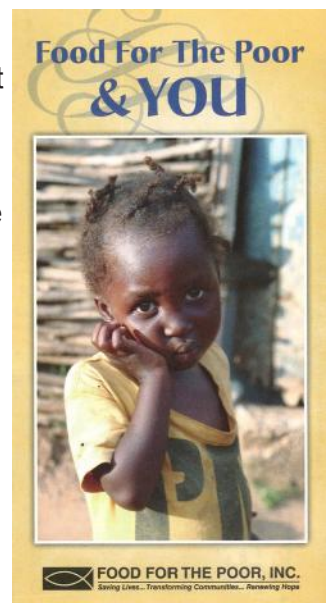
Check out www.foodforthe poor.org for insight/information on the vital work the donors do on behalf of those who are destitute in the world.

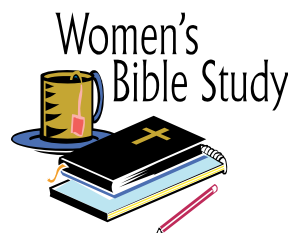

FIRST LUTHERAN YOUTH

'And the King will say, 'I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me!' Matthew 25:40

Thanks to your generosity and prayers, we as a congregation served the least of these in Pine Ridge. Much to our surprise, we were served and had incredible kindness bestowed upon us. We saw God moving and working in so many amazing ways. The Lakota people were incredibly welcoming, loving, and very generous. It wasn't uncommon for people to walk up to us and thank us for being there. Even though we didn't wear or have anything on affiliating us with NextStep, people just knew that's who we were with. That was a pretty awesome feeling to be with a ministry that is that active and present in a community.

Our Sensational Six were part of a group of a 107, made up of youth and chaperones from Boulder, Colorado and St. Lois, Missouri. We were split into 9 work crews. We were based out of Wounded Knee and spread out to a few neighboring communities. Work projects ranged from: roofing, sanding & painting, framing for an addition, improving a deck, and siding. Our project was a little different from the rest. We had the privilege of serving an amazing woman named Ruby. She is truly one of the most selfless and loving people I have ever met. Whatever Ruby is given, she turns around and gives it right back to her people. She has a very large garden and a pen full of chickens. Everything that they produce is given away to those that need it. During the summer months Ruby brings in 32 gospel singers and puts on several concerts throughout the summer as well as puts on clothing and food drives. The majority of the events happen in her front yard under her carport. We were excited to improve this carport/make-shift-stage/storage area. We spent our workdays framing two sides of the carport/stage and then tinning those two sides to offer shade and protection from the wind. As we started to wind down on that project, several of our youth started working and planting in Ruby's enormous garden. The Reservation is known to be a fruit and vegetable desert as they are hard to come by with no grocery stores around. This was rather eye opening for all of us as we take access to fruits and veggies for granted.

It didn't take us long to fall in love with Ruby. Throughout the week she shared with us that she had just lost her husband six weeks earlier and some of the tragedies in her long life. She didn't let any of that bog her down and her love for God just shines through in everything she does. Every day we were there, multiple carloads of people would come to her house in need of everything from diapers, blankets, and food. She never turned a single one away and did her best to meet their needs. Every time she spoke of the reservation she would refer to them as her people. It was very evident to us she would do anything and everything she can for them. I was very impressed with our youth and encouraged to see how inspired they were by Ruby. It wasn't uncommon to see one of them sitting and visiting with her. After hearing many of her stories and seeing what an impact she had, the youth decided that they want to take donations and raise funds to get Ruby some apple trees for her yard and her beloved people. If you are interested in helping with this please let me know!

It was really hard saying our 'see ya later's' to Ruby and the Lakota people but we will be back! From the bottom of my heart, Thank You! Thank you for all your support to make this amazing week happen. The impact of this trip on the reservation and on all of us who went will be long standing. I hope someday God shows you what the impact of your donation and prayers did during this trip.
