

NALC Convocation

August 9-11, 2017

2017 NALC Convocation focuses on Discipleship and Reformation

Nearly 700 NALC members gathered August 9-11 for the 2017 NALC Convocation in Nashville, Tenn., around the theme, "Holding Fast: Being Reformed."

The 500th anniversary of the Reformation provided a focus for the Convocation. The leaders of the largest Lutheran churches in the world were featured speakers for the worship services. The Rev. Dr. Fredrick Onael Shoo, Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania, was the preacher for a festival service observing the Reformation anniversary. The Rev. Yonas Yigezu, President of the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus, preached for the opening worship of the Convocation Mission Festival.

The Rev. Dr. James Nestingen and the Rev. Dr. Nathan Yoder delivered keynote Bible study addresses on Reformation themes. The Rev. Dr. Jared Wicks addressed Martin Luther from a Roman Catholic perspective, and Carmen Fowler LaBerge addressed the Lutheran Reformation from a Reformed perspective.

The NALC's focus on discipleship featured prominently in the Convocation. Bishop John Bradosky provided a keynote address and Bible study on discipleship for the Mission Festival. Discipleship was also a focus of his report to the Convocation and of other speakers and workshops.

The NALC Mission Festival began the Convocation under the theme, "Renewing Congregational Life Through the Word of God." Keynote addresses were given by Bishop Bradosky, the Rev. Dr. Gemechis Buba, and the Rev. Dr. Joseph Parsalaw of the

Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania. Church leaders from around the world took part in a panel discussion on congregational life in their countries. Workshops addressed a variety of topics.

Stuff the Truck for NALC Disaster Response was a great success. So many supplies were brought for NALC Disaster Response that a larger truck needed to be obtained. Donated supplies included 400 quilts, 366 health kits, 112 school kits, 70 flood buckets, and 225 Bibles.

The Bishop election process will remain the same as proposed constitutional amendments were not approved.

Elected to the NALC Executive Council to four-year terms were Brian E. Sutton of Statesville, N.C., and Pastor Mark Braaten of Tyler, Texas. Pastor Jeffray S. Greene of Brooks, Ga., and Lyle Hollander of Boyden, lowa were elected to the Court of Adjudication. The Convocation also ratified the election of Julie Eskeland to the NALC-Canada Section Governing Board.

\$20.18 budgets were approved. The Convocation approved a \$2.1 million operating budget for the NALC. Budgets were also approved for NALC designated funds: \$543,000 for the Theological Education Fund (which includes the North American Lutheran Seminary); \$165,500 for the Great Commission Fund; and \$64,000 for the Disaster Response Fund. Budgets anticipate spending some cash reserves. Delegates also approved a resolution encouraging congregations to increase their benevolence giving to the NALC by at least 1 percent of their congregational budget annually.

The Braaten and Benne Lectures in Theology, the annual theological conference which precedes the Convocation, focused on theological perspectives on the Work of Christ. The speakers were Dr. Don Collett, Dr. Gordon Isaac, Dr. Paul Hinlicky, Dr. David Luy, and Dr. David Yeago.





All McLean County residents in need are welcome to receive food and household goods at no cost.

The Community Cupboard of Underwood is one of the food pantries serving Underwood, Washburn and the surrounding area. The pantry is open the first Thursday and the third Saturday of every month. In the first quarter of 2017 the pantry has served 66 families, half of which are from Washburn. With national changes in funding services the Great Plains Food Bank, which is a supplier of food and personal items to food pantries across the state, cannot offer the quantities it once did. Because of the increased use and decreased availability of food stuffs, the Community Cupboard of Underwood is in need of everything. Box, canned and dry foods are needed. Personal items, feminine products and laundry soap are also needed. Also needed are general donations to buy items and keep the Community Cupboard operational. A box will be in the narthex during the month of September for your donations.





DVD based Bible Study beginning September 17

As of the printing of the newsletter we are unsure if there will be materials to buy or a cost for this study.

Encounter a 15th-century religious reformer from Germany who broke ranks with the Catholic Church. This Bible study is the first of a three-part series devoted to Martin Luther—a monk whose Spirit-inspired grasp of God's justification of sinners through faith in the Savior was the cornerstone of the Protestant Reformation.

In this five-session Bible study, Luther's life and times are examined through the lens of history, religion, and theology. Expanding on commentary from Rev. Gregory Seltz, Speaker for *The Lutheran Hour*, numerous scholars add their expertise and perspective to render an illuminating portrait of the life of this extraordinary human being.

As a forlorn sinner feeling lost and desperate before a stern and exacting Judge, Luther despaired of all hope for eternity. But as one who came to cling to the Spirit-delivered truths of justification by faith and the liberty believers experience by God's grace, he rebounded to become a triumphant ambassador for the Gospel.

The details of Luther's life—his childhood with his parents Hans and Margaret, his university pursuits, his decision to become a monk, his protestation of Catholic practices, his voluminous and erudite scholastic output, his life in hiding, and his roles as husband and father—are all considered in this study. *A Man Named Martin* offers a fresh look at an individual who, down through the centuries, has increased in importance and vitality to the Christian church.



STEWARDSHIP CENSE



"So Peter went over to the side of the boat and walked on the water towards Jesus. But when he looked around at the high waves, he was terrified and began to sink" Matthew 14: 29-30

A few weeks back, I thought Pastor had a great sermon. Of course, all Pastor's sermons are good, but once in a while there's one that particularly speaks to us. Such was the case with this one. It was on "fear". Pastor talked about the fear the disciples often felt when they saw Jesus doing strange things. He talked about the fear Peter felt when he insisted he would not deny his Lord. Fear can be a paralyzing emotion and cause us to do things we perhaps would not do otherwise if the fear were not there.

I began to think that maybe it is our own fears that keep us back from doing or being involved in stewardship the way we should be or would like to be. Perhaps it is fear of not having enough time to help with a particular project in the church or community. Maybe it's the fear of commitment or that we will get TOO involved and not be able to get ourselves out of such a project. It may be fear of not having enough money to see us through the month that keeps us from giving only 1% more of our monthly income to the general fund or "Raise the Roof" fund or other benevolence funds of the church. Perhaps it is when we are confronted with such fears that we really need to remember some of those fears that the disciples felt when they put themselves on the line for the Lord. Who is the

only one that took those fears away? Who is the only one that can take some of our own fears away today to be able to step out in love, kindness and stewardship? Something we all need to think and pray about, yes?

Lots of stepping out in good stewardship around in our community this past month. Construction started on our new McLean Resource Center. How many opportunities there will be for us here by next summer? Also I saw that Prince of Peace Lutheran held (by the time you read this) another Mobile Pack for Feed My Starving Children, an organization that provides meals to hungry children in more than 70 countries for only about 22 cents per meal. This is something we may want to consider in our quarterly charitable benevolences. Praise the Lord for these fine acts of stewardship!

And as always, Praise the Lord that we have our new roof and gutters installed and because of your acts of stewardship we are over the \$57,000 mark with only about another \$13,000 to be raised. Thanks to everyone who has made this project go so guickly and smoothly.

Have a blessed Labor Day! Please remember, serving others allows us to continue by His Grace to be His faithful stewards.

Don't forget to pick up items for the LWR School & Personal Care Kits and bring them to the church. FLCW will meet on September 12th at 7:00 pm with the quilting ladies and put the kits together for shipping in October. Following are items needed for the school and personal care kits:

School Kits:

Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approximately 8" X 10½"; no loose-leaf paper

One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

One pencil sharpener

One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band

One box of 16 or 24 crayons

One 2 1/2" eraser

Personal Care Kits:

One light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" & 52" x 27"), dark color recommended 2 or 3 bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging One sturdy comb, remove packaging One metal nail clippers, remove packaging
