This year marks the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Reformation. Imagine that – 500 years since Martin Luther began a personal spiritual journey which has challenged and changed many people. We have had a series of articles in our bulletins which tell about some of that history. Hopefully you have had time to read them. If not – let us

know we can get them to you. You'll be able to find all sorts of information if you search the internet about the Reformation.

I would like to share one Bible passage which touched Martin Lutheran. Romans 1:16-17. "<sup>16</sup> For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. <sup>17</sup> For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

You most likely have heard or read many times about Martin Luther – how hard he tried to find peace with God. He became a monk. As a monk Luther would fast, spend many hours in prayer and frequent confession. But in spite of everything he did he felt an inner spiritual dryness. He became very critical of his own failings and felt his sinful nature becoming magnified rather than transformed.

As part of Luther's studies he discovered Romans 1:16-17. The Gospel is the power of God for salvation. The Gospel appears foolish to the world. But the Holy Spirit takes that Gospel, creates faith in us and brings salvation to us through it. Justification, being right with God, is not something we can do for ourselves. Being justified happens through God's word, it is God's act. Our righteousness happens through faith in Jesus Christ. It is this truth that changed Martin Luther, and though he did not intend it, eventually caused the beginning of the Lutheran denomination.

Martin Luther writes "...Enlightened by the Holy Spirit, I finally examined more carefully the word of Habakkuk: 'The just shall live by his faith' (2:4). From this passage I concluded that life must be derived from faith.... Then the entire Holy Scripture became clear to me, and heaven itself was opened to me. Now we see this brilliant light very clearly, and we are privileged to enjoy it abundantly."

One of my study Bibles has this quote, "The righteousness of faith ... is nothing else than the forgiveness of sins and the gracious adoption of the poor sinner for the sake of Christ's obedience and merit alone."

Jesus, thank You for redeeming us and giving us Your righteousness.

Come and join us on Sunday, October 29th, as we celebrate the Reformation in our lives.

See you at worship!
