#### November, 2017



November is known for a lot of things in and out of the church. We have the beginning of hunting season. People are in the process of cleaning up their yards, getting them ready for

the winter months. More and more stores gear up for the Christmas shopping season. The end of November or the first of December also marks the end of the church year and we transition from the season of Pentecost to the season of Advent.

In the middle of all of this is the day of Thanksgiving, which is actually a public holiday, but which has also been incorporated into the church schedule. We have set aside this one day as a day to give thanks for the past year. There are a few things that happen on this day which may distract us from its main purpose. Many people have called it "Turkey Day", referring to the fact that many people make a large meal which often includes turkey. Then there is football that you can watch most of the afternoon and into the evening. Many stores use Thanksgiving Day as the beginning of their Christmas shopping. And there are probably a few things that we have not mentioned.

When you check out "thanksgiving" or "giving thanks" in the God's Word, one of the passages you will find is from Ephesians 5 "...giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ....". One day a year is not enough. We are to give thanks always and for everything. Every day is to be a day for giving thanks.

When you look at more passages, you will find that Jesus gives thanks before giving out the loaves of bread and fish when he fed the 5000. Jesus gives thanks at the Last Supper as he blesses the bread and wine before he gives it to His disciples. The Apostle Paul gives thanks for the Christians in Ephesians – for their faith and for their faithfulness in their service.

When I was growing up, our family began our meals with a table prayer and then we ended with this prayer, "O give thanks to the Lord, for He is good and His mercy endures forever."

Ok, time for me to quit and for you to stop and think – What am I thankful for? Maybe even do it as part of your thanksgiving meal this year. And I realize that many of you reading this are going through a particularly tough time in your life. Still – in spite of that, and in the middle of that – the Lord encourages us to give thanks to Him – if nothing else – for his love, forgiveness, and salvation.

From the first centuries after Christ, Christians who died a martyr's death were considered saints, who live in God's presence forever. Every year, on the anniversary of the martyrs' deaths, Christians would visit their tombs and celebrate the Eucharist. This practice grew throughout the centuries to include remembering other outstanding Christians on the days they died. Soon the entire calendar was filled with memorials of the saints. In the ninth century, Pope Gregory IV designated November 1 as the day to remember all the saints living in God's presence.



It contains the entire Audio Drama New Testament and selected Psalms chosen specifically for "warriors," yet it's only about the size of a pack of chewing gum.

Designed to military specifications for safe and discreet use in low-light conditions, it features a matte black finish and red-light-only operation — and runs on a single AAA battery!







## STEWARDSHIP ¢ENSE



#### "Ask and it shall be given unto you, seek and you shall find," Matthew 7:7

I think this month's newsletter will not be so much on stewardship, but on one of my long held beliefs. If we truly believe in a God who answers prayer, is responsible for all we have, is all powerful and wants us to have everything we need, then we should **NOT** be afraid to give Him the glory for anything and everything we say and do. In other words, I do not believe we give God credit for nearly enough that goes on in our lives. We tend to take that credit for ourselves instead of recognizing that God had a hand in it. For example, how often do we say, "oh, I'm so glad I made enough food for everyone," or "I'm so happy I didn't make any mistakes in that recital piece." Or "I couldn't believe we made that much money on our bake sale or rummage sale or whatever".....instead of saying: "I'm so glad God provided enough food for everyone" or, "I'm so happy God allowed me to play that recital piece without error" or, "I am so thrilled God knew how much money we needed to make at our rummage sale to take our church trip"....

In other words, do we really try to recognize when God is answering our prayers and we are only the "vessel" that makes it possible? The other night at our council meeting, I had just finished giving my Stewardship report. I had mentioned how great it was that we only had about another ten thousand dollars to raise and how nice it would be if we could perhaps be "over the top" by the first of the year. I realized this was a bit of a stretch. (You know what a doubting Thomas I am, right?) Then Jeannette, our ever faithful secretary, spoke up, she said we had just received a rather large donation for coal royalty that usually got put in the parking lot fund and was wondering if we wanted to continue putting it in there or another budget line. To my surprise, everyone wondered if it could be put towards the roof fund. Long story short, I made a motion, it was passed and we are now several thousand dollars closer to having our goal of paying off the roof by the first of the year. What I didn't say, but said later in my nightly prayers, was to thank God for putting that money in front of us as an answer to prayer. We should have acknowledged that fact at the council meeting. I hope you can see what I'm getting at...we need to give God the Glory. This is a fact Martin Luther understood well! We are not the answer...the church is not the answer. God is the answer!

Praise the Lord for this beautiful fall we are having and most assuredly, Praise HIM for Martin Luther!

I will be adjusting the thermometer on November 1 to reflect our total after the October 29 offering. As of October 22 we have \$61,111.69 and only need \$8,238.31 to finish our "Raise the Roof" fundraiser. Once again we can say, Praise the Lord!

#### Dear friends and family,

I just wanted to say a very big <u>THANKS</u> for donations and prayers for our Guatemala Mission Trip 2017 this past March. We had an <u>amazing</u> adventure this year!

We were able to attend the grand opening of the NEW Casa Jackson malnutrition hospital, which will now be able to admit up to 88 babies and toddlers! This is the only malnutrition hospital in all of Central America. It was fun to be able to unpack ALL of our amazing donations and organize them right into the new hospital. We are <u>so grateful</u> for all of the washcloths, blankets, quilts, toys, hats, socks, shoes, and clothing for the babies and children. We had some very sick babies/toddlers this year. Two of our little 18-month olds weighed in at 12-13lbs. We had a busy couple weeks of putting on the pounds, so to say. And that we did.

I took some time to visit our sponsor children and enjoy very special moments with them shopping and taking them out to eat. This is always my absolute favorite part of my time there, catching up with all our "family". With our monetary donations we were able to get some children eye glasses and purchased the ever necessary nutrition formula for the babies of Casa Jackson.

For three days this year we built a HOUSE! 12x16 with a cement floor (cement we mixed by hand!) Cement board walls, rain spout, roof and we put in a window and a door with a LOCK! This is not common for most families there, and truly makes the world of a difference for them.





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We were blessed to work with two ladies from Maine-Helen and Mary- both in their 70's! They have built several houses so their experience was priceless. The cost of building this home is \$2,500! Our team of 7 raised the money for the build as well the items we filled the home with to include bunk beds, toys, food, sheets, blankets, pillows, towels, medicine and more.

To date this is the most humbling thing I have ever done in my life. The third day as I gently swept the newly laid cement floor that I wanted to be spotless before the family moved in I stood there with my broom and the tears began to flow. I briefly thought of how much I have in North Dakota and how very lucky my family and I are. We really do have everything and more. For a moment I felt guilty...then I realized I was sweeping the floor of a house in Guatemala that we had just built in three days time! What an incredible gift to give, and in return to receive a full and humbled heart!

I am blessed to be able to be a part of the indescribable work that The God's Child Project does. With all of your support, love, cash, gifts, and prayers this is what I GET to do.


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#### A MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS



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
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#### FELLOWSHIP CENTER CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

As donations are received, work has continued on the fellowship center. Here are some construction details.

- ⇒ Before winter settles in, the outside of the building will be completed, including:
  - Siding and roofing
  - Concrete, both inside and outside
  - Landscaping, including grass
  - Graveled roads
- ⇒ Sheetrock inside is being completed by volunteers from First Lutheran Church, Mandan. Thank you!
- ⇒ Tables for the new dining space were purchased at a low cost from the City of Garrison. Chairs have been donated by a Garrison organization. Thank you!
- $\Rightarrow$  Listed below are the remaining items that need to be completed before the building can be occupied.
  - Mechanical Systems at a cost of \$377,500
  - Kitchen at a cost of \$327,200
  - Septic System at a cost of \$284,000
  - General at a cost of \$283,950
  - These items total \$1,272,650.
- ⇒ Through various funding sources, there is approximately \$400,000 currently available for use, which will allow us to complete the outside projects before winter and start on a few of the remaining items listed above. The rest of the funding to complete the building, which is approximately \$800,000, will come from the new "Let's Do This One More Time" campaign that is currently being launched.
- ⇒ We will continue to keep you informed of building and capital campaign updates, but please feel free to call the camp downtown office at 701-337-2246 and ask Janis for updates, questions, or concerns.


