

The Psalm that I have chosen for this month is Psalm 32. Again the Psalm is to long to print here so I would encourage you to read the whole Psalm on your own. The theme of the Psalm comes from the first verse. *"Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered."* The Psalm goes on to describe the process that the author, King David, went through.

There was a period of time when David did not confess his sin. What he feels is described in verses 3 & 4. *"For when I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer."* 

Verses 5 & 6 describe David's confession: "I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD," and you forgave the iniquity of my sin."

There is a verse of reassurance of God's help in verse 7: "You are a hiding place for me; you preserve me from trouble; you surround me with shouts of deliverance."

There is word of advice to all of us who are sinners: "*I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you. Be not like a horse or a mule, without understanding, which must be curbed with bit and bridle, or it will not stay near you.*"

The Psalm ends on a note of triumph and an encouragement to trust the Lord even when, and especially when we are dealing with our sin.

"Many are the sorrows of the wicked, but steadfast love surrounds the one who trusts in the LORD."


"Be glad in the LORD, and rejoice, O righteous, and shout for joy, all you upright in heart!"

Only God can relieve the troubled heart. We are reminded of another verse from 1 John 1:9 *"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."*



# First Lutheran Church Women Executive Board Meeting February 7, 2018

Attending: Cathy Sheldon, Donna Gunderson, Kathy Keller, Peggy Moran, Marlys Knell, Sylvia Thompson, and Val Swanson

Opening devotions were led by Cathy.

Discussion centered upon the following:

- 1. Camp of the Cross The annual meeting of the Camp of the Cross will be held February 25<sup>th</sup> at Augustana Lutheran Church in Underwood. We are able to have three representatives at the meeting. February 8<sup>th</sup> is Giving Hearts Day and they are looking to raise \$100,000 to help finance the new building. Camperships were discussed for the upcoming year. Previously, the FLCW has contributed \$70 per week and \$40 per half week with the council and other committees also contributing to the campership cost with an unknown donor picking up the remaining campership balance. The main camp is \$375 per week and \$225 per half week. Two children have already registered. A motion was made and seconded that FLCW contribute \$75 per week and \$45 per half week for individual camperships. Motion carried.
- Minutes The Secretary was thanked for compiling the FLCW 2017 notes for the annual report. For informational purposes, minutes of meetings held will now be published in "The Parish News."
- 3. Treasurer's Report \$2,500 in FLCW treasury. The 2018 budget was reviewed. \$500 has been given to Camp of the Cross for Giving Hearts Day. In the fall, the camp budget item will be re-visited. After some discussion it was agreed that the World Mission's *African Soul, American Heart* donation was very worthwhile. A letter was received from them explaining what the donation was used for was read. In April, one specific budget item will again be reviewed.
- 4. Committee Reports
  - a. Community
    - i. Meals on Wheels were delivered in January. The other two meal delivery months are May and September.

- World Day of Prayer will be held on March 2<sup>nd</sup>. Materials have been ordered. This is the FLCW's March general meeting. The community will be invited to attend. Work Group 3 serves. The executive committee members will present the program. A meeting will be held on February 21<sup>st</sup> at 5:30 to go over parts and discuss the luncheon meal.
- b. Quilting Quilting will be held on February 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- c. Kitchen No report.
- d. Growth Work group 5 serves the Confirmation Tea not Work group 1 as listed in the FLCW booklet.
- 5. New Business -
  - Lenten meal FLCW is in charge of the meal on February 21<sup>st</sup>. Two members of each workgroup will help serve the following which will be assigned on a rotational basis:
    - i. Work group 1 bars and coffee
    - ii. Work group 2 soup
    - iii. Work group 3 soup
    - iv. Work group 4 soup
    - v. Work group 5 bread and crackers
  - b. Labor of Love The next community meal will be on February 18<sup>th</sup>. Menu is taco bar. Flyers will be posted and there will be a signup sheet for donations.
  - c. Goodies from the Heart coming in April.
  - d. Several months ago, we discussed joining the Women of the North American Lutheran Church. In researching this, there is no membership fee for joining. Membership application has been submitted. Their website is <u>www.wnalc.org</u>. Their newsletter can be read or printed off from this website.



We thank you for your ongoing support this past year. We also bring you news of great joy! China Service Ventures (CSV) is officially approved to register a Representative Office in Xinyang City, Henan Province. We are now authorized to resume our operations in the mainland of China under the auspices of the Henan Bureau of Education and the Henan Public Security Bureau. Below is a picture of our registration certificate.



During the week of Feb. 1 - 8, 2018, a small CSV Delegation will be present for the signing ceremony. We have already secured office space. Soon we will register with China's Tax Commission and receive our Company Seal to open our bank accounts. We will be fully operational in China by the Chinese New Year (Feb. 16th — The Year of the Dog). Our scope of authorized activities includes: school facility renovation projects, student financial scholarships (Bo Ai), off-site creative programming (i.e., outdoor ventures and camps), faculty and student development and exchange, and cross-cultural networking and relationship building.

After a suspended year of operations and numerous document submissions, we begin this new year with blessing and focused activity. We are very excited. We hope you are too!
