The business meeting was kept to a minimum (about 12 minutes total.) We had great times of worship, good speakers and breakout sessions, and good Bible Studies. I was able to reconnect with long-time friends, many of them from college days. And we met new friends.

We were also reminded of what the LCMC is about: "Free in Christ, Accountable to one another, Rooted in the Scriptures and the Lutheran confessions, and Working together to fulfill Christ's command to go and make disciples of all nations."

The theme for this assemble was "Growing up" and used the following verses from Ephesians 4 as a focus.

¹¹ And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, ¹² to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³ until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, ¹⁴ so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. ¹⁵ Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love. – Ephesians 4:11-16

We can talk about many things from these verses. Here are a few that came from our Bible Studies. The big picture of Ephesians is how we grow up into Christ. We are created for ministry. We are called to unity. We are Conformed to Christ. Our congregation celebrated the 125th Anniversary in 2008. Yet we still have room to grow as followers of Christ. BIOGRAPHY OF JESSIE VEEDER

Jessie Veeder has been a symbol of folk music in the badlands of Western North Dakota since she released her first original album when she was only sixteen years old. It was an effort that sparked the interest of music enthusiasts and took her from performing at fairs and festivals around her home state to managing a national college and coffeehouse tour and recording her fifth original album in Nashville in 2015.


With unique and interestingly beautiful vocals, Veeder's lyrics swell with references to her own life experiences growing up on a working cattle ranch in the rugged land of Western North Dakota. Veeder's ability to captivate audiences with stories of her love for the landscape, the culture and the people of small town America is what pulls at the heartstrings of audiences across the globe and made her original music such a success.

Beyond the music it's Veeder's story that has gained her a global following. Her popular website <u>"Meanwhile, back at the ranch..."</u> chronicles life on the Veeder Ranch and the success of her website has landed her a job as a weekly columnist for state-wide newspapers and as a commentator on Prairie Public Radio.

Jessie has been a featured artist at the <u>National Cowboy Poetry Gathering</u> in Elko Nevada and was a main stage act <u>Red Ants Pants Music Festival.</u> She was named North Dakota's Favorite Folk Artist for 2016 and 2017 and is a recent recipient of the North Dakota Ambassador Award.

Backed by some of the best players in the state, Jessie's skill as a heart wrenching songwriter soars in songs that remain rooted in the stories of the people and landscape of her home in Western North Dakota. Listeners can expect to be transported with familiar stories and compelled to sing along to classics.

HOPE FOR OUR HEROES - The Military BibleStick



Sunday, November 11th (Veteran's Day) First Lutheran will have a special offering for the Military BibleSticks. \$25 pays for one BibleStick.

Around the world the men and women of the U.S. military are defending our freedom and helping to fight the war on terror.

Many of these soldiers, sailors, airmen, and Marines live in cramped quarters with other personnel, in very uncomfortable and challenging circumstances, working hard and putting in long hours every day — too tired to read a Bible, even if they have one.

The Military BibleStick reaches these service men and women, deployed in some of the most dangerous areas of the world, with God's Word in audio — It can go with them and sustain them in even the most difficult circumstances.

It contains the entire Audio Drama New Testament and selected Psalms chosen specifically for "warriors," yet it's only about the size of a pack of chewing gum.

Designed to military specifications for safe and discreet use in low-light conditions, it features a matte black finish and red-light-only operation — and runs on a single AAA battery!

Each service member who receives a Military BibleStick also has the option to request a free Audio New Testament or Kids Bible for family back home — although they may be separated from loved ones, they know they are listening through the Word together.

Military BibleSticks provide real hope for our heroes!

One thing both Larry and I learned was a little bit more about the structure of the LCMC. It was helpful to Larry and me, so I am going to put a couple of those things in my newsletter this month. First, they do NOT consider us to be in a synod or a denomination but rather an Association and a Movement. LCMC congregations should view their local churches as places where people in the community come to get connected with God and one another. Secretarial Minutes approved as written and posted in "The Parish News".


Treasurer's Report – No report.


