When we think of the story of the birth of Jesus in the Bible, the Christmas story, we usually first think of Luke 2. "And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." (Luke 2.7). After that we think of the story that Matthew tells, more from the viewpoint of Joseph. "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." (Matthew 1.20-21)

We don't usually think of the Gospel of John when we think of the Christmas story, but there is one there. John begins like this: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup> He was in the beginning with God. <sup>3</sup> All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. <sup>4</sup> In him was life, and the life was the light of men. <sup>5</sup> The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1.1-5) Then we have the proclamation that tells of Jesus coming into the world. "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1.14)

Jesus, God's Word, was born into our world to save us from our sins. Jesus is "Immanuel" – "God with us."


A favorite Christmas Carol for all of us ends with this verse. It is our prayer at Christmas and all the year through.

Man, I've been waiting all year to be able to say that! I hope this finds you well and in great holiday spirit. We are going to be sending some Christmas spirit down to Pine Ridge again this year. We are taking donations of clothing of all sizes, winter gear, blankets, craft and art supplies, toys, books, and anything you would be happy to receive. Donations can be left under the balcony staircase in the narthex.

We will be serving brunch after the Sunday School's Christmas program. We hope you can join us for our fabulous egg bake, fruit, and toast. Not only will you get some delicious food served by some amazing kids but you will be helping them raise funds for our upcoming mission trip to Pine Ridge this summer!

I know, I know, you are getting really sick of seeing this same paragraph about Pizza Day. Here's the thing, if we didn't need the donations for it, I wouldn't be asking for your help on this monthly project. The impact is great and it's been an amazing ice breaker to get kids in the door and comfortable in a church. Every dollar, package of cheese or even donation of dough helps out immensely! I can't say thank you enough to those who have donated or came and helped. I know the youth greatly appreciate it too! On average we go through roughly 16 packets of pizza dough, two jars of pizza sauce, one can of alfredo, two packages of pepperonis, one package of Canadian bacon, one can of chicken, one package of bacon bits, one can of mushrooms, one jar of olives, one can of black olives, a package of cherry tomatoes, four large packages of mozzarella cheese, one package of cheddar cheese, four 2 liters of pop, chips, ice cream, cookies, napkins, paper plates, and plastic spoons. Things very a little from month to month but these are our staples.

"For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty..."


If you weren't in church on Veteran's Day, you missed a great stewardship sermon. The first reading was from 1 Kings where God sends Elijah to Zarephath to be fed by a woman who only has enough food for her own family and fears she will die as she has nothing else. Elijah tells her not to fear, that the Lord will provide and of course that is exactly what happens. How do you suppose the woman's faith increased when she and her household ate for many days? And then there was the Gospel reading from Mark with which we are more familiar. Jesus tells us here to beware of those who boast and give out of their abundance and laud their riches over everyone. But rather look to the poor widow who gave out of her poverty and put in everything she had and all she had to live on. I guess I've said this before in this column, but I think it bears repeating. Be careful of the "why" when we are giving. Sacrificial giving is not necessarily the way to earn God's love and our salvation unless we are doing it for the right reasons. How does the children's song go? 'We love because He first loved us." We need to "give" because he first loved us also. In our weekly devotional on the back of our bulletin we find Hebrews 9:26 which

says all that we need to know about giving. "Christ has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself."

This Christmas season how will you look at your giving? Will you give so that others may see you or will your giving be a true sacrifice because of his sacrifice for us?

In closing, have a beautiful Christmas and Holiday Season....and always remember: **He is the reason for the season**! See you in the new year!






