As I read the definition I couldn't help but draw a connection between the definition and what it means to follow Christ. It's exciting to think of having a regular clean slate to start fresh with His forgiveness, grace, and guidance. I don't know about you but that makes me even more excited and grateful for the New Year!

A huge thank you to everyone who donated fleece, clothing, food, etc., for Pine Ridge! Our church family never disappoints or ceases to amaze me! I can only imagine the impact your donations will have on the people of Pine Ridge not to mention the great example you are setting for our Youth!

I know, I know, you are getting really sick of seeing this same paragraph about Pizza Day. Here's the thing, if we didn't need the donations for it, I wouldn't be asking for your help on this monthly project. The impact is great and it's been an amazing ice breaker to get kids in the door and comfortable in a church. Every dollar, package of cheese or even donation of dough helps out immensely! I can't say thank you enough to those who have donated or came and helped. I know the youth greatly appreciate it too! On average we roughly go through 16 packets of pizza dough, two jars of pizza sauce, one can of alfredo, two packages of pepperonis, one package of Canadian bacon, one can of chicken, one package of bacon bits, one can of mushrooms, one jar of olives, one can of black olives, a package of cherry tomatoes, four large packages of mozzarella cheese, one package of cheddar cheese, four 2 liters of pop, chips, ice cream, cookies, napkins, paper plates, and plastic spoons. Things very a little from month to month but these are our staples.

On back of this page are suggestions for prayers every hour from 8:00 am - 8:00 pm for each of the Three Days of Prayer.

Our attitude toward prayer has often been characterized by saying, "well, all we can do now is pray!". Prayer is not the hopeless act of desperation. Prayer is a gift that God has given to us as a means to approach the throne of grace with confidence—like that of a child coming to her parents sharing concerns, victories, defeats and every part of life. It is an opportunity to express the deepest heartache and the greatest joy. Prayer is a conversation between the Creator and the created...and the conversation began with God, for us, in Christ Jesus.

#### Day One: January 1

This is a day focused on **confession**. We have made our lives, our relationships—and even the church—in our own image. We confess that the church belongs to Jesus and not to us. We gather to lay down our pride, our sin and our agenda and ask the Lord of the church for forgiveness, which He gives freely and with mercy.

#### Day Two: January 2

This is a day of **petition**. Pray for your congregation, for the pastor, for the leaders, for those who carry out ministries, for the Sunday School teachers, for the Confirmation leaders, for those leading adult Bible studies and for those leading small groups. Pray for those in hospital and nursing home ministries. Pray for all those connected to your church that they might know God's redeeming love for all in Christ.

#### Day Three: January 3

This is a day for **vision**. Pray that the Holy Spirit will again move through the hearts and minds of leaders and pastors that God's vision for His church might be revealed and fulfilled. This is a time of prayer for renewal, revival and encouragement. Pray for God's vision.
