One of my many favorite passages from God's Word is this one from Romans 8.

#### God's Everlasting Love

<sup>31</sup> What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? <sup>32</sup> He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? <sup>33</sup> Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. <sup>34</sup> Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. <sup>35</sup> Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? <sup>36</sup> As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." <sup>37</sup> No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. <sup>38</sup> For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, <sup>39</sup> nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Certainly one of the truths that I have tried to share with you over the years that I have been at First Lutheran in Washburn is that God loves us with an everlasting love. If there is any problem in a relationship with God the problem is with us, not God. God is for us – what an amazing and reassuring thought. No matter how many other people and things in life seem like they are against us, we can always be assured that God is for us.

There are many things which try to separate us from the love of Christ. Some of them are named in the verses above: tribulation, distress, persecution, famine and so on. Some of these we have already experienced. And there are others we have experienced which are not named here. However, Paul is clear – there is nothing in all creation which will "be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." What an amazing and reassuring promise to hang onto throughout our lives.

As we move forward from one stage in life to another we cling to this promise. "Nothing will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

#### LWR SCHOOL KITS

Before we know it school supplies will be on sale! That is a great time to buy supplies for our Lutheran World Relief school kits. Following are the items needed to fill one kit. Let's see how many we can fill this year!

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approximately 8" X 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"; no looseleaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centi-

meters on one side and inches on the other

- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2 1/2" eraser

How do you summarize everything from an incredible week into a small newsletter article? Well I guess we are about to find out! Our trip to Pine Ridge was amazing! I cannot thank you enough for your prayers and donations that made this trip possible. We kicked our journey off on June 15<sup>th</sup> and spent the day exploring South Dakota. We camped in the Badlands National Park. The weather was perfect and we got a lot of hiking in. We got into Pine Ridge Sunday afternoon and went straight to Ruby's. We were excited to see the fruits of Aaron and his crew's labor! He had gone down the Wednesday before we left. Aaron, his brother-inlaw, and our friend Michael Schiff had framed the carport so our youth would have a leg up on the week. We met Schiff on our first mission trip to Pine Ridge in 2017 when he was a chaperone with his church from the St. Louis area. Like Aaron, Matt, and I, he fell in love with the Lakota people and has made several trips to Pine Ridge on his own to help the Next Step staff on numerous projects on the reservation. After we walked through the jobsite Ruby informed us that she was planning on having a dedication for our project on Friday! Talk about a little pressure!

Sunday evening we arrived in White Clay and stayed at Lakota Hope. Our accommodations were what the Next Step staff referred to as Tiny Homes, and that they were! The staff had built triple decker bunks inside the unfinished homes. This in itself was an eye opening experience and helped us relate to the community members as many sleep in tight guarters with many roommates. Our meals were served outside and ate under a large tent, we used a specially made bathroom and shower trailers, and had nightly worship services under an outdoor pavilion. I don't think they could have created a better environment for us to understand the lifestyle that many on the reservation have, even if they tried. This was merely happenstance that the accommodations worked out the way they did.

Monday kicked off the start of our work week. Next Step had set up community involvement activities within the community throughout the week so our time at our jobsite fluctuated daily. Rather than giving you the daily, I'll just give you the breakdown of what all our youth did on the jobsite. They had to remove the floorboards, reinforce the floor by adding and cementing more posts into the ground, reinstalled and added floorboards, installed Styrofoam and insulation in the floor, wrapped the house, hung j channel, hung the tin, installed 2 windows, insulated the walls, put OSB on the ceiling and walls, hung the door, framed up a dividing wall, added electrical outlets, lights, and a baseboard heater. Due to some shorter work days and wanting to have as much done as possible before the dedication, we stayed later when possible and took volunteers to stay behind and work. It was pretty impressive how are kids worked and I was super touched that the three youth that had been on our previous trip to Pine Ridge stayed behind to work so the others could tour the Red Cloud Indian School. On Friday we had three volunteers that staved with Aaron and Matt as there wasn't enough work to warrant all of us staying. Madison and I took the rest of the youth to the Mammoth Site in Hot Springs for our Free Day Friday. We made a quick trip to Hot Springs and were eager to get back with our whole crew and Ruby so we could help get ready for the dedication ceremony. When we got back to Ruby's, we were so excited to see they had built steps and even had the lights on! It was really something to step back and marvel at the structure we helped construct in just 5 days' time. Even more so, to think of all the amazing things God is going to do inside the walls of that buildina!

The dedication ceremony was beautiful. Ruby had invited many of her 'family' members and two pastors she works closely with to bless the carport/ stage turned multi-purpose building which is now called the Goldie Mae Hope Center. This Center will host bible studies, food and clothing drives, serve as an emergency shelter in the winter and much more. As Ruby so eloquently put it, it's a small building but it serves a big God! Our youth group, the Next Step staff, Ruby and her family and several others all circled around the walls inside the Goldie Mae Hope Center as Pastor Asa blessed it. As I was soaking in the moment, I counted 35 of us standing inside with room for many more! After the blessing, several of Ruby's family, these are the people she has taken in and have become her right hand in all her projects, came to each and every one of us to shake our hands and thank us! Talk about a humbling experience! Afterwards, we made our way outside where these beautiful souls who have next to nothing had prepared and served an Indian Taco feast for us! It was so moving and something I will not soon forget. Ruby wanted us to make sure you all know how much they appreciate our congregation and youth's generosity in making a dream come true for her and her people. As we prayed and said our good-byes she told us we had brought a piece of Heaven to them! Not sure if it was the lingering sawdust in the air or what but there wasn't many dry eyes left in the room!





If we don't teach our youth to follow Christ, the world will teach them not to.


