





...A FEW MORE LCMC CONVENTION TIDBITS...

Most of you heard from me at a church service a few weeks ago but thought perhaps I should tell you a little more about some of the wonderful speakers and singers that helped put on the convention.

Rachel Scott kept us entertained with her contemporary music. Rachel resides in Omaha with her husband and three boys. She is a singer, songwriter, (She wrote a special song just for the convention), and worship leader and works with several non-profit organizations such as Compassion International Love 146 and her own non-profit called Rachel's Challenge. She has two albums out which can be found on all internet outlets and ITunes Worldwide.

Greg Finke is the executive director of Dwelling 1:14. He has through this organization, trained thousands of everyday missionaries to join Jesus on His mission. His philosophy is an: "Each one, Teach one" philosophy. The people who go through his training then go out and show their family and friends how to do the same to bring others to Christ.


