"11 For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope."

~ Jeremiah 29:11 (ESV)

Grace and peace be with you all as we walk ahead together. I wanted to say thank you again for all the cards and well wishes as well as for the congregation gift for my ordination. The conversations I have had with many of the congregation members over the last month have been very fruitful and I look forward to continuing to get to know everyone better. Thank you for all who helped with the ordination and installation service and made the weekend such a special and joyous event. You all have become our family and you are so valuable to us and in the Lord's eyes.

The passage (above) from Jeremiah is one that receives a lot of traction, especially during big moments like graduation, or when plans are being made or discovered. It comes to mind for many occasions. Digging a little deeper into this passage we discover a prophecy that was spoken to the exiled people of Judah as a whole. In this section then, Jeremiah wrote that the exiled people were to "build, live, plant and eat" (29:5). They were to "seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare" (v. 7). This direction was to show them that they were to prepare, live and thrive even in these circumstances that they found themselves and to fight the notion that exile was going to be over soon. It also showed the missional reality for this small community. They were invited into the larger public process of the empire and this part asserts the reality of exile and their responsibility to be fully engaged with it.

Verse 11 then moves the vision to the horizon of Judah beyond exile that was to assert the hope of return from exile. There is a promise in this section that Yahweh (God) will keep the promise of homecoming, that God did not intend evil for His people. This tension between deep judgment and the powerful purpose of God that is held together both in the heart of God and in the destiny of Israel that there is a future willed by God that refutes any despair which Judah has experienced.

Today, we find ourselves in difficult situations and dealing with stresses and anxieties that no recent generation has experienced (COVID-19 and a polarized election that will greatly affect our nation). Amid all of this, we find comfort in God's Word and as a community we can walk together in faith.

Moving forward, we need to know the promise of God for us and to continue to seek His guidance and plans for our ministry together. We must not halt our ministry but continue to build, live, plant and eat together in old and new ways. No matter your political opinion, we need to hear the words of Jeremiah to pray for our Nation, to heal and become unified no matter who is elected November 3rd. Whether you feel in exile right now or may after the election, the same God is Lord and

king of all. He will bring us peace and a future beyond where we are now. We are all citizens of heaven and need to remember when speaking to those who may hold different opinions than us. We can take these instructions to prepare, live and thrive even in these circumstances and find where God is leading us. We need to seek God's face and continue to ask God to guide the Future plans of First Lutheran Church.

Looking to the future, there are some ideas beginning to be explored on ways to better CONNECT those who are joining FLC Online and those who are participating in-person. Please, look for the article CONNECTIONS and a possible PRAYER SERVICE (in this newsletter) that would be held online. Will you join me in prayer for FLC, our future and our nation as we walk together?

FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH UPDATES REGARDING THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC AS OF COTOBER 16, 2020

UPDATE regarding Governor Burgum's continuing COVID-19 guideline changes over the upcoming weeks/months. Pastor Chuck, the FLC council members, and staff are making efforts to address these changes as they happen. In these trying times, we can hold fast that we serve a God that is in control despite a world that seems out of control.

"For God has not given us a spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." 2 Timothy 1:7

As such, with prayerful consideration we are moving forward with church services being offered both in person and online. A few recommendations moving forward:

- Every family is encouraged to attend church, Sunday school, or other activities in the manner that they feel most comfortable (whether on -line or in person)
- Social distancing will be observed, by family unit (maintaining six feet apart).
- Hand sanitizer is available at multiple locations within the church.
- Face masks are strongly encouraged but not required. Please bring your own mask if able, if you do not have one available a mask will be made available for your use.
- No food is to be prepared in the kitchen at this time, and there will be no coffee hour.
- Due to recent changes, if you are signed up as a worship volunteer moving forward and decide to join online instead, please contact Jeannette with your replacement.
- If you are joining online and would like the Sacrament of Holy Communion, please contact Pastor Chuck.
- It was determined that small groups of no more

than 24 people are the only groups allowed to meet at the church at this time with the exception of Sunday School.

- After the service has finished, please fellowship outside for adequate space for social distancing.
- The FLC website (www.flcwashburn.com) and Facebook will be updated as we continue to monitor the situation and any new developments. Please check these sites for updates or concerns. If you do not see an answer to your concern, please feel free to reach out to Pastor Chuck or Jeannette.
- We ask that you remember your tithing for the church. Either send your payment to the church or drop it off at Farmers Security Bank in Washburn notating it is a donation for First Lutheran Church if you will not be attending worship at the church.

According to some sources, the idea for All Saints' Day goes back to the fourth century when the Greek Christians kept a festival on the first Sunday after Pentecost (in late May or early June) in honor of all martyrs and saints. Other sources say that a commemoration of "All Martyrs" began to be cele-

brated as early as 270 CE but no specific month or date is recorded. Pope Gregory IV made All Saints' Day an authorized holiday in 835 CE. It is speculated that the chosen date for the event, November 1, may have been an attempt to supplant the pagan Festival of the Dead (also known as Samhain or the feast of Saman, lord of death).

All Saints' Day is not to be confused with <u>All Souls' Day</u>, which was first instituted at the monastery in Cluny in 993 CE and quickly spread among Christians.

On All Saint's Sunday we will remember the following First Lutheran members along with those whose service was here at First Lutheran who have gone before us since November 1, 2019.
