The staff and the whole FLC family wish you a Merry Christmas and a



At the most recent NALC Convocation, they voted to amend the organization's constitution. As a congregation of The NALC we have been asked to vote "yes" or "no" on the two amendments at our next called congregational meeting on Sunday, January, 24, 2021. The full article will be available for anyone to review at the church and at the annual meeting. A summary will be included in the annual report that can be read ahead of time.

The two constitutional amendments that we will be voting on involve how the NALC 1) apportions lay delegates (giving more flexibility to the Executive Council) 2) changing requirement of Annual Convocations to Biennial Convocations (cost savings).

FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH UPDATES REGARDING THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC AS OF NOVEMBER 17, 2020

UPDATE regarding Orders from ND Governor's Office and ND

Dept. of Health:

As a religious organization, the FLC executive committee has reviewed the subject COVID 19 related materials, and in prayerful consideration we are moving forward with the following guidelines:

Church Services- in-person

- Facemasks will be required in accordance with the Governor's/State Health Officer's orders
 - Masks must be worn when entering or exiting the sanctuary. Please bring your own mask if able, if
 you do not have one available, the church will continue to provide disposable masks barring any
 supply/availability issues.
 - This does not apply to those who are exempt from ND health order, such as those with medical conditions, children 4 years old and under (children under 2 years old should never wear face coverings), etc.
- Social distancing will be observed, by family unit (maintaining six feet apart).
 - O Pews will remain in usual position to allow for the most space per family unit
- Circumstances where mandatory face coverings may be temporarily removed (from state health officer order part 6) that are applicable to our services
 - o Pastor Chuck (or others using mics up front) while socially distant in leading the service
 - o Musicians to play instruments (as long as they are able to be socially distance)
 - o While a family unit is sitting in the pew during the service when social distancing is possible
- After the service has finished, please fellowship outside for adequate space for social distancing.

Sunday School/Confirmation/Other small group activities held at the church

- All small groups are still welcome to meet
- · Facemasks will be required when attending any of these activities at the church
- To accommodate more families to come see the Sunday School Christmas Program safely, we will be splitting the program into two separate programs with 20 minutes in-between, more information on this coming soon!

All previous guidelines remain in place:

- Every family is encouraged to attend church, Sunday school, or other activities in the manner that <u>they feel</u> most comfortable (whether on-line or in person)
- Hand sanitizer is available at multiple locations within the church.
- No food is to be prepared in the kitchen at this time, and there will be no coffee hour.
- The FLC website (<u>www.flcwashburn.com</u>) and Facebook will be updated as we continue to monitor the situation and any new developments. Please check these sites for updates or concerns. If you do not see an answer to your concern, please feel free to reach out to Pastor Chuck or Jeannette.
- If you are joining online and would like the Sacrament of Holy Communion, please contact Pastor Chuck.


Romans 15:13


