Greetings! And a happy new church year! The season of Advent is upon us as we look forward towards Jesus' birth and back to a sense of waiting and watching. In the world around us, the consumer push begins earlier and earlier every year. By the time Christmas Day is here, decorating and shopping has been happening around us for months.

In the Church we are called to do the opposite. During the season of advent, we are called to slow down. The focus of the season of Advent is a time of holy waiting and watching for Christ's return and the celebration of his birth. Advent is a time set apart for the focus on salvation breaking into the world through the person of Jesus Christ. This time of waiting and expectant watching for the coming Messiah while our worship holds this tension between thoughtful waiting and joyful anticipation.


As I was reflecting on my personal devotions, I was taken back to the opening to the Gospel of Mark. The New Testament quote from Mark 1 above is a quote from the prophet Isaiah that describes a messenger who was to come before the promised Messiah. Many Isaiah passages, (which are featured prominently in the Advent season), bring words of hope to those discouraged by years of exile and the bleakness of the Jerusalem to which they returned. The ancient mythological imagery of God as the triumphant divine warrior bringing the exiles home through the wilderness served Isaiah as a word of hope. The good news in Mark is that those hopes have finally been fulfilled."

The call here to prepare helps to order our days leading up to Christmas. We just finished preparing for Thanksgiving, whether we had a huge feast or a small gathering, especially now many are focused on gift buying, party planning, visiting family & friends and so much more.

As a church family, Advent provides a yearly rhythm of slowing down to prepare for our coming King. A special focus during worship this Advent will involve the lighting of the Advent candles each week. We will have a time to slow-down and hear a reading and prayer about significance of the four candles of the Advent Wreath: Prophecy, Bethlehem, Shepherds, Angels candles.

May God bless your time of preparation as we await with expectant watching of the child in a manger.

The focus of this year's prayer will be the following:


January 4

We will be encouraging all those who participate to pray wherever they are and set aside some time each day (whether 15 minutes or more) or short time each hour throughout the day. The church will also be open from 9 am to 3 pm for private prayer. There will be a booklet available in the Narthex for anyone who would like to use a prayer resource by December 24.

There will be a prayer service offered on Thursday, January, 7, 2021 at 7:00 pm at the church and online for us to join together as the Church and pray with our LCMC brothers and sisters in Christ.



It is hard to believe that we are over halfway complete through this confirmation year. I think it is important to keep the congregation aware of what we have been doing in confirmation this year. We have made some adjustments in the structure of our confirmation program. The first has been the curriculum that we are using for our Wednesday nights (as shown above) Grow Students by the company called Stuff You Can Use. The images also included here are the Big Ideas or main point for each lesson that students get to explore as a confirmation class. There is also a Discipleship focus for each quarter of study. Our focus so far this year has been a focus on Spending Time with Others. The strategy and focus in the fall, is developing the spiritual on habit of Christlike community when teenagers are beginning a new school year, making new friends, and getting plugged into new small groups. Since we have over 20 students registered, we also break the students into smaller groups every confirmation night.

We also focus on the traditional elements of the Small Catechism in an accelerated format which we are calling Theology Nights. We had our first Theology Night in November focused on the 10 Commandments. The students did a great job studying the 10 Commandments and summariz-

ing each with the question, "what does that mean" and they also discussed how they can apply each of the commandments to everyday life.

We would not be able to do what we do without our great Confirmation Team! I am especially thankful for them this year and how they are investing their energy, time and heart into these young Christ followers. Our Café Team: Maybell Job and Claudette Ness who provide amazing meals for the students each week (as well as many others who give yummy treats and bars ©). Our small group leaders: Judy Beaudry, Steph Mann, Sharon Nelson and Jeff Schmidt who lead their small groups every week. We are also blessed with many who have been willing to pinch -hit when someone is out sick or has a scheduling conflict: Dwight & and Margaret Rasmussen, Lexie Solomonson, Emily Retterath. For our theology night, Theresa and Brent Petersen did a great job exploring the 10 commandments with Steph and myself rounding out the team. This ministry would not be possible without each of these volunteers. THANK YOU!

Most of us are familiar with the Advent traditions in churches. Because of the commercialization of the Christmas season, many have found that celebrating the Advent season in their homes may also add to their book of Christmas memories and customs. Perhaps you want to light an Advent candle each week and read part of the Christmas story as a family. Your children may deepen their appreciation of the true meaning of this Holiest of Seasons.

Like so many of our Christmas customs, Advent ceremonies are an adaptation of practices that date back to even pre-Christian times. Some of you may know that back then candles were lighted around a wheel during the festival of the winter solstice to celebrate the return of gradually lengthening daylight. The symbolism of this ancient ceremony takes on an entirely new meaning for us as we anticipate the birth of Christ and the enlightenment his coming brings to our lives.

The Advent wreath: In keeping with the ancient customs, some Advent candleholders have remained circular in shape. However, you can center your Advent ceremony around any of the new contemporary candleholders. Some holders come with a fifth candle which is white. It can be lit on Christmas day in celebration of his coming, bringing the hope of eternal life to the world.

How will you celebrate Advent this year? I pray that you will find your family Advent ceremony will become one of your families favorite customs.

Have a beautiful Advent and don't forget Jesus is the reason for the season! Merry Christmas!

One final note: Please remember to attend the annual meeting in January, 2022 as there will be lots to discuss and the board always wants your input!

#### New Business -


- December 12<sup>th</sup>, FLCW choir will present their Christmas cantata during the church service. No potluck.

Yet even amid inconvenience, I see God's purpose. We were thankful to have a grill and slow cookers in the meantime. We creatively attempted to cook favorite meals in different ways. And though we craved anything baked in an oven - cookies, casseroles, even chicken nuggets - we realized that waiting eight weeks for an oven isn't truly a trying time.

Many of us wait for much greater milestones and miracles: physical healing, the return of a prodigal child, an end to financial struggles. Paul offers us hope as we wait: "May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had" (Romans 15:5, NIV).

When you're in a season of waiting — including Advent! — consider what you're thankful for and what you crave. Tell God how you're feeling and ask for endurance while you wait.




