"34 A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. 35 By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

John 13:34-35

Greetings to you! Grace, mercy and peace be with you. As we continue through the season of Epiphany, we are able to reflect and worship with one of the oldest seasons in the Christian Church Year, second only to the Easter season. The season is marked by two "feast" Sundays at the beginning and end of the season: The Baptism of our Lord, and the Transfiguration of Our Lord. The color during these Sundays is white, which is the color of divinity, purity and joy. The weeks in-between the feasts focus on the growth of Jesus' ministry, and the color green is used to symbolize that growth.

We may see in our readings a focus on Jesus' ministry and what this confession of faith means to the Church (the one-church with Jesus as its head) today. We see through our feast Sundays during this season how Jesus steps down into baptismal waters so that He can soak up the sins of the world: He is baptized into our sins so that our Baptism might be into His death and resurrection for the forgiveness of sins.

The New Testament was written in *Koine* Greek (common Greek) which differs slightly to the modern Greek that is spoken today.

The word "love" is described by four different Greek words in the New Testament: *Agape love, Storge love, Phileo love,* and *Eros love.*

Agape love: highest level of love, everlasting sacrificial (i.e., God is love 1 John 4:8 uses this Greek word, 1 Cor 13)

Storge love: familial love, deep and caring bond (i.e., concern shown by Jairus for his sick daughter – Luke 8:40-56)

Phileo love: warmth and affinity, brotherly love, (i.e., Instructing us to love our neighbor as if they were our brothers, Romans 12:10)

Eros love: romantic or sexual love, *Eros* or sexual love in and of itself is not impure, but is a gift from God to married couples so that they may express their love with one another and continue the human race.

In the above verse, John is using variations of the *Apage-love* form. John is describing the love that we are to show one another. *Apage-love* is perfect love. God demonstrated this perfect love when He sent His only Son to be sacrificed as an atonement for our sins (John 3:16) and that through our belief in Jesus, we may have eternal life.

Jesus instructed us to strive to also love one another in that perfect way. The same word used here in John 13:35 is the same word used in John 3:16. This type of love is a tangible love. This love proves to the

faith community and to everyone that they are sons and daughters of Christ, as quoted above, "By this all people will know that you are my disciples. If you have love for one another."

Lent will be right around the corner at the beginning of March and we are also offering another great opportunity for couples to grow in their faith with a one-day only Marriage Matters seminar.

There are many articles to follow in this month's newsletter of what God is doing in the lives of FLC members and in our surrounding community!

AUTO-LOCK DOOR & SECURITY SYSTEM

We now have a door that will have an auto-lock function and have regular hours of opening for the church 7 days a week. This door was a solution found by council to give regular hours for the church. It was also to balance security while still giving open access to the building to those who need to use the building. A big thank you to the technology committee members (Dick Bickert, Mac Beaudry, Matt Gardner, Melissa Rothe and Pastor Chuck) as well as council for their help over the last 6 months to find a workable solution.

Auto-Lock Door.... How will this work?

- Which door? Narthex Side Door (handicap accessible)
- Hours: 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. 7 days a week
- Security System: correspond to the setting of our auto-lock door
- Cameras: continue to have 24-hour monitoring at all entrances

Do we need keys to get in the building?

- The Narthex-side door will be open every day with the above hours. When events/services are held at the church we will have all the doors open as usual. However, outside of Tuesday-Friday 9 a.m.- 5 pm, please utilize Narthex Side Door.
- Who will have a key? The pastor, staff and property chair.
- All others with keys please turn in your key to the Church Office.

RAISING HOPE MINISTRY

Individualism is hailed as a value in our society, and it is tempting for me to believe I don't need anyone else. I tell myself I am strong and capable. I tell myself no one understands me, and I can't expect them to. I don't need anyone else. But God didn't create us to operate as individuals. He created us for communion with one another. Christ loves the church. The church is his Bride. He cherishes and nourishes it (Ephesians 5:29). He gave Himself for the church. As much as I wanted to pull away, I knew I wasn't created to do this alone. I was created to live in fellowship with the body, and when one part hurts, we all hurt together (1 Corinthians 12:26).

This was written by Kristin Hernandez author of Sunlight in December. She lost her precious baby boy moments after he was born due to health complications.

I have felt a strong connection to other grieving Moms after our son, Isaac, was stillborn on August 4, 2021. Fellowship and God's word is the foundation for Raising Hope Ministry that will be starting at FLC. I feel called to lead this group and it is my hope to offer support and resources for parents that are being challenged by the grief that comes with infertility, miscarriage, and infant loss.

This group will be an outreach ministry of FLC and open to the community if you have anyone in mind that would benefit, please let them know. The group will be meeting on the first Monday evening of every month. Time and start date are TBA. RUTH MINISTRY

And Ruth said...

What followed these three simple words changed the course of two lives—two women who had experienced a series of losses: first a husband and father, then two sons and a husband! The older woman, Naomi, released her two daughters -in-law from any responsibility they felt for her and turned from a life in a foreign country to return home to what was left of her family.

These were the words which changed her life:

"Don't urge me to leave you or turn back from you. Where you go I will go, and where you stay I will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God. Where you die I will die, and there I will be buried. May the Lord deal with me, be it ever so severely, if even death separates you and me." Ruth 1:16-17 (NIV)

I want you to Stop. Look. Listen. If you will take a minute to do this, I think you will agree with me about the exchange that took place between two women in the throes of grief. I believe it had lifechanging impact.

- 1. Ruth is not giving a half-believable emotional plea to make Naomi feel better.
- 2. Naomi knew Ruth was serious when she invoked the Lord's help—she realized Ruth was determined to keep her word(s).
- The people in Bethlehem weren't expecting Naomi to have someone with her—they even wondered if it was her. They were stirred up by Ruth's presence.
- 4. God in his sovereignty had the scenario all set to benefit both women—it was harvest time around Bethlehem and being the city of the ancestry of Naomi, there were potential prospects for Ruth's future.
- Ruth's commitment to Naomi helped give her the courage to own her experiences of grief and loss and to call them what they were—misfortunes and bitterly painful. This

is necessary in the healing process and without good counsel and support, it can be overwhelming.

Imagine the difference in Naomi's outlook for the future with Ruth at her side!

I'd like to be able to tell you exactly what this group will look like, but to be honest—I've never done this type of support group or whatever we'll be calling it! We're going to be patient and let those who choose to participate give us that input and help us shape this into the ministry that it needs to be.

The group is open to anyone who feels the need or a nudge from God. Please feel free to contact either Steph or Deone for questions, interest or input.

For now, we are tentatively planning a kick-off informative event to explore some of the ideas we have and to get your input. We haven't set a date yet and we are praying for a co-leader to join us. Right now, we're thinking Tuesday evenings at the church with time, length and lunch negotiable!

We can build this ministry on the talents, spiritual gifts, treasures, and the willing hearts of women who've loved and lost on life's journey!




