<sup>13</sup> "If you turn back your foot from the Sabbath, from doing your pleasure on my holy day, and call the Sabbath a delight and the holy day of the LORD honorable; if you honor it, not going your own ways, or seeking your own pleasure, or talking idly; <sup>14</sup> then you shall take delight in the LORD, and I will make you ride on the heights of the earth; I will feed you with the heritage of Jacob your father, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." Isaiah 58:13-14

Greetings to you and your family. This month we will be taking a brief look at the Spiritual practice of Sabbath.

To get us started, here is an example quoted from Wayne Muller's book Sabbath:

"Light a candle, alone or with friends. Let each of you speak about those things that are left to do, and as the candle burns, allow the cares to melt away. Do not be anxious about tomorrow, said Jesus. The worries of today are sufficient for today. Whatever remains to be done, for now, let it be. It will not get done tonight. In Sabbath time we take our hand off the plow, and allow God and the earth to care for what is needed. Let it be .... "

This quote about Sabbath draws us in to describe our Spiritual Longings that God has placed in our hearts that most may think about or dream about but rarely venture to put it into practice. This self-reflection helps us especially in this season of Lent to reflect on our rhythms of work and rest.

What is Sabbath keeping? It is the spiritual practice or discipline to weekly set aside a day to intentionally be with God and rest. This will capture your body, soul and spirit. You will long for the space and time to slow down your pace, where family and friends can linger with one another, savoring one another's presence because no one has anywhere else to go.

"The reality and point of the sabbath is to honor our need for a sane rhythm of work and rest. We then can honor our body's need for rest, and our spirit's need for replenishment and soul's need to delight itself in God for God's own sake.<sup>1</sup>"

From our Isaiah passage above, this day that is set apart is not to be day focused on our own ordinary, day-to-day interests. The sabbath is to be a day for God set apart, honored. This is a day that is not to be preoccupied with our own things, is the ultimate focus of our worship, and gives access to the material joy that God wants to give (v.14). Next month, we will explore some basic principles for sabbath keeping and putting this idea more into practice in our lives. In April, we will finish

our Lenten journey that concludes with our grand celebration of Easter, with Alleluias and Easter morning praise. May God help us to focus our attention on him and continue to learn together in our lives of faith.

**Special Offering:** At FLC, until Easter, we will be collecting a special offering that will be sent to support the <u>Samaritan's Purse Emergency Field Hospital</u> in Ukraine. This is an opportunity for us to help those who are hurting, and are in need, to receive care, and help and especially hear the Gospel.

"It is a 58-bed hospital on the outskirts of Lviv and includes an emergency room, Intensive Care Unit and Two operating rooms—providing Samaritan's Purse medical staff with the capacity to perform up to dozens of surgeries per day.

In addition to the hospital, they are operating a 24-hour medical clinic at a train station in Lviv where thousands of women and children are transiting through each day.

"Samaritan's Purse has about 140 disaster relief specialists on the ground between Ukraine, Poland, Romania, and Moldova. Please pray for our team as they share God's love with people who are hurting and need the eternal hope of Christ". (From Article above)



#### LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF PROJECTS

The following items are needed for LWR kits. Exact items are requirements by LWR and can not be substituted for anything else. <u>ITEMS NEEDED BY APRIL 22 FOR THE SPRING</u> <u>IN-GATHERING IN MAY.</u>

#### SCHOOL KITS:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approximately 8" X 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener large with catcher
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five <u>unsharpened</u> #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One **2 1/2" eraser** the long pink ones

#### **BABY CARE KITS:**

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies)
- Two long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- 2 or 3 bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 or 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars.
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

#### PERSONAL CARE KITS:

- One light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" & 52" x 27"), dark color recommended (Need lots of these)
- 2 or 3 bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- One sturdy comb, remove packaging Big tooth or detangling combs
- One metal nail clippers, remove packaging



Proposed changes to the Endowment Fund bylaws were approved which included general language cleanup to meet North Dakota Century Code and clarifications to distribution of unrestricted income and scholarship requirements. Camp Director Rev. Janis Sloka III expressed interest in putting together a committee to celebrate CCM's 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary which will take place in a couple years. He also stated the need for college age camp counselors which helps determine the number of campers that can be accommodated in the Summer 2022 sessions. The row cabins have all been renovated, the old dining hall is seeing new purpose for summer season only use, and plans are to renovate the church on the CCM grounds. Treasurer Nick Klemisch reviewed the financial report and reminded participants that there are several thousands of square feet of buildings that need to be continually maintained and updated. He also stated CCM is in good financial condition, but supplies and food costs continue to rise. Donny Giffey and Jill Denning Gackle stated the financial position has improved over the years, thanks to donations and good fiscal management. 
