holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect" ~1 Peter 3:15

We have jumped into the heart of summer and the season of Pentecost. We are establishing new summer rhythms of worship, bible study and life in general as we get to enjoy the longer days of sunshine. We can thrive this summer by discovering new ways to share our faith.

One joy already this summer is the conversation we've been having in the Sharing Faith Group on Tuesday morning/evenings. It has been great to hear the discussions and hear from these lovers of Jesus. We have discovered that we are meeting to help grow in our understanding, and mature in our skills, so that we can learn more ways to share our faith with our friends and neighbors.

The above Scripture is helpful in our minds-eye that EVERYONE is called to witness. This witness begins with a person's own faith. We must know what we believe, teach, and confess according to God's Word. Making a defense might include the image of a courtroom, defending your faith. But, more likely Scripture speaks to give an account of the hope that we have in Christ. This is especially true when we ourselves as Christians, leaders, fathers, mothers, daughters, sons, etc. go through adversity, hardship, slander, and suffering (1 Peter 3:16 -17). How we react and respond in these situations is paramount to the reflection of the new creation that we are called to be in Christ. This act of "defense" is truly more an act of love as we are to do it with "gentleness and respect." Defending the Gospel should not be done with arrogance or militance; God calls for a gentle witness to the truth.

During the first week of the Sharing Focus group, our focus has been on doing the things you love with those who do not know Jesus. The discussion drove us through the thought that we have freedom in doing the things we love and how this can be an opportunity for relationship and sharing Jesus. This does not mean the common image of a salesman as the evangelist, but the image of a friend, being with someone and allowing spiritual conversations or questions to arise naturally. This takes the pressure off especially for those who find sharing faith challenging.

The second week, through a survey, we were able to discover our God given gifts that we can use to share our faith. We were answering the question, "what is my role?" The takeaway is that in Scripture there are many gifts, and we must work as one body, a team for our corporate witness to each other, the community and beyond.

June 15, 2022 COUNCIL MEETING

Church Council Minutes

(Please not that minutes are not approved until voted on by the council at the next meeting.)

The Church Council met on June 15, 2022, at 6:30 PM. Present were: Matt Gardner, Aaron Solomonson, Mac Beaudry, Pastor Mann, Julie Bentz, Lee Kugler, Jeff Schmidt, Melanie Beckman, and Janet Hanson. Absent was Sarah Kadrmas. Also present was Jeannette Rost.

The meeting was called to order.

Pastor led with devotions on making disciples, and importance of discipleship as presented by Rev. Mark Vander Tuig.

Kugler/Schmidt to approve the minutes from May 19, 2022. Carried.

Solomonson gave the treasurer's report. The following balances are on hand: CD's: \$150,000.00; Checking: \$108,703.49; Building: \$32,696.01; Cemetery: \$617.40; Interest: \$8,757.18; Music: \$1,336.74; Parking Lot: \$700.00; Worship: \$2,703.44; Morgan Stanley: \$11,992.40. Total Assets: \$317,506.66. Beaudry/Beckman to approve the report for future audit and to pay all non-budgeted bills. Carried.

Pastors Report: Presided over one prayer service/funeral service, and a graveside service. He has met with staff and members. Both the computers have been upgraded, had an update on the second service discussion, there were eight participants for the Sharing faith study. He will be on vacation July 11-25.

Committee reports:

Stewardship-Bentz didn't have anything to report. Worship-Schmidt has visited with members about vacation bible school and all had fun. There were around 80 total participants in PreK-grade 6. Evangelism-Beckman has been planning for the Annual picnic which is on July 6.

Mutual ministry-Beaudry reported he has talked to D. Gunderson about the decorating of the Church. The committee is looking at having a

committee which will be a sub-committee of one of our committees we have already.

Old Business:

We have \$461.92 in Thrivent Choice Dollars. Work is still continuing on the Endowment.

Youth Director: The mutual ministry is working on this. It has now been advertised in different papers/sites. Melissa Rothe worked with the youth until May. Beaudry/Beckman to give Rothe a gift card for \$500.00 in a thank you card for helping with the youth this past year. Carried.

The parsonage basement bathroom has been remodeled and now there are finishing touches that need to be done.

The council looked over a draft for the policy for Church use. We will continue to look it over and make changes.

The annual gathering and convention for the LCMC is Oct. 2-5. Early bird sign up is until Aug. 15

New Business:

Schmidt/Solomonson to pay the following benevolences for the 2nd quarter: \$375.00 to Dakota Boys Ranch (US/Local Missions), \$375.00 to Wycliffe Bible Translators (Global Mission), \$125.00 to Disaster Response fund of the NALC (World Hunger), \$125.00 to Our Daily Bread and \$125.00 to Sola Publishing (Relief Missions). Carried.

There were no transfers in or out.

The next meeting will be on Aug. 10 at 6:30 PM. (No meeting in July-we have the Annual picnic.) The meeting was adjourned at 8:00.

Bentz/Schmidt to adjourn. Carried.

We ended with the Lord's Prayer.
















































RIVERBOAT DAYS - JUNE 11, 2022






