⁹ But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession,

that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰ Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. ~ 1 Peter 2:5, 9-10

Greetings to you! Ready or not, September is here. We are looking forward to many great ministries starting up again this fall, from Confirmation, youth groups, Sunday school classes, Bible studies and much more to come.

How do you see yourself when it comes to ministry? Do you think that you have a ministry that God is calling you to participate or lead in or a ministry that you have discovered as your Christian calling?

Short story...While my family was on vacation this summer while we were visiting my sister in South Carolina, we went to my sister's NALC church. Something caught my eye right away in the bulletin on the list of worship leaders. First in the list was "Ministers: people of St. Peters."

The above passage from St. Peter reminds us of who Jesus is. In verses 1-4 St. Peter describes God's word as a life-giving milk that one craves and is good to taste. By verse 5, He moves to the imagery of Christ as a stone. The cornerstone of our faith. He is then the foundation which we can build our lives. We are then the living stones being built up as a spiritual house. We then understand how Christ is the light of the world and he calls us out of darkness into His light. Through this, he makes us His own, gives us a place as citizens of His kingdom, and empowers us to live as His royal priesthood. We are not alone but are part of His people, a holy nation. Now that same Savior calls us to tell others of His love.

Through the grace of God, we can then see what God has done in Jesus Christ and what God is doing in these Christians. Ultimately, we are precious in God's sight. Through eyes of faith we can understand verse 10 as key. This is foolishness to unbelievers because it seems as though the Christian believers are being rejected, are aliens and exiles, foolish and straying. Christians are chosen as Christ is the cornerstone of faith. God's people are, holy, blessed and royal.

Martin Luther wrote about what is now generally considered the doctrine of the priesthood of all believers. In Luther's writing, if you have faith in Christ and are a baptized Christian you share in the mutual priesthood. This is what the people of God, God's people are called to be. We are a royal priesthood, set apart.

This is also a key part of the NALC common confession:

CC5) The Priesthood of All Believers

We believe and confess that the Holy Spirit makes all who believe in Jesus Christ to be priests for service to others in Jesus' name, and that God desires to make use of the spiritual gifts he has given through the priesthood of all believers.

So now what? Can you see yourself with eyes of faith as a royal priest set apart to do ministry for Jesus? Do you see ministries that you want to share in?

We will continue to see where the Holy Spirit guides our congregation as we start a new year of many ministries.

What ministry can you participate in this fall? What ministry would you want to help lead? Where is Jesus calling you to live out your calling as the Minsters of First Lutheran Church?

The Church Council met on August 10, 2022, at 6:30 PM. Present were: Matt Gardner, Aaron Solomonson, Mac Beaudry, Pastor Mann, Julie Bentz, Jeff Schmidt, Sarah Kadrmas, and Janet Hanson. Absent were Melanie Beckman and Lee Kugler. Also present was Jeannette Rost.

The meeting was called to order.

Pastor led with devotions on church leadership and how do we spend our time as a church group as presented by Rev. Mark Vander Tuig. (Eph. 4:11-13)

Beaudry/Kadrmas to approve the minutes from June 15, 2022. Carried.

Solomonson gave the treasurer's report. The following balances are on hand: CD's: \$150,000.00; Checking: \$104,763.22; Building: \$32,971.01; Cemetery: \$617.40; Interest: \$8,761.03; Music: \$1,471.74; Parking Lot: \$760.00; Worship: \$2,703.44; Morgan Stanley: \$11,992.40. Total Assets: \$314,040.24. Schmidt/Bentz to approve the report for future audit and to pay all nonbudgeted bills. Carried.

Pastors Report: Pastor presided over two graveside/funeral services. He has met with staff and members. Second Service open discussion will be on Sat. Aug. 13, Confirmation will start on Aug. 31 with a meeting and the first week in Sept. they will start with classes, audio upgrades have been completed.

Committee reports:

Education: Kadrmas reported the first day of Sunday school will be Sept. 11. She is working on getting teachers-but has most.

Property: Kugler wasn't here, but in his report he said the air conditioners in both the Pastor and Secretary's offices need to be replaced. He received a couple bids. A motion from Schmidt to have the two replaced was withdrawn and will be tabled for a future meeting. There is a hole outside that water collects in and needs to be filled in. Kugler will take care of this. Trees at the parsonage need to be trimmed.

Old Business:

We have \$461.92 in Thrivent Choice Dollars. Work is still continuing on the Endowment. Youth Director: Pastor Mann and Beaudry reported on this. The mutual ministry met with Melissa Rothe and discussed the position. They recommend the hiring of her. The board discussed the contract. Kadrmas/Bentz to approve the contract with Melissa Rothe for Coordinator of Student Ministries with the changes that were discussed. At this time Hanson asked to abstain from voting because of conflict of interest. Kadrmas/ Solomonson approved to allow Hanson to abstain from voting. Carried. The motion to hire Rothe was voted on and carried.

In the parsonage basement bathroom, only the painting needs to be finished.

The property use policy was tabled.

The annual gathering and convention for the LCMC is Oct. 2-5. Early bird sign up is until Aug. 15.

New Business:

The Women of the church asked the Council for help with the annual fall cleaning of the church. They received a bid from Arrow Service team for a general clean and carpet cleaning. After discussion, it was decided we will try an all member clean-up which Schmidt and Kadrmas will head up.

We received a request from Candisc to help with a meal when they come through Washburn. But because the date is this coming week-end, the board decided there wasn't enough time to prepare for it.

The Church received a letter from Camp of the Cross telling us we had a credit of \$1,195.00 because they had to close down for a while because of COVID. They are wondering if we want to donate some (since there still were expenses to cover) or receive a check for this amount. This was tabled for next month.

There were no transfers in or out.

The next meeting will be on Sept. 15 at 6:30 PM.

Bentz/Schmidt to adjourn. Carried.

We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

22 CONVOCATION

Highlights from the 2022 NALC Mission Convocation

Hosted by the North American Lutheran Seminary August 5, 2022 The 2022 Mission Convocation has ended after more than 400 delegates and visitors gathered online to celebrate another year of ministry and mission in the North American Lutheran Church (NALC).

The biggest highlight came this year in the form of the 2022 NALC Ministry Report video, which celebrated the growth of the NALC in a little over a decade, while also reporting on its work in the past year and sharing where it is headed in the next season. The full video, located online, touched on:

- Congregations and pastors which have recently joined the NALC;
 - New mission starts as well as local, domestic, and global mission strategies;
- Newly appointed area assistants to the bishop and progress on the centralized office in the Dallas/Ft. Worth, Texas area;
- The growing North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS) network of schools, faculty transitions, and a special call for congregations to raise up new ministry leaders;
 - Expanding candidacy pathways, including the initiation of the NALC diaconate and "Ordination Under Special Circumstances" (OUSC), as well as pastoral care opportunities in small congregations;
- "Fresh Eyes for Mission" renewal summits, Renewal and Aging Ministry online courses, and NALC Life-to-Life Discipleship resources;
- Youth and Family Ministry transitions;
- Ongoing Disaster Response efforts;
- Continued Communication Ministry growth in mission districts;
 - Launch of the Today, Tomorrow & Forever initiative;
- And snapshots of many other NALC ministries.

The NALC officially launched the Today, Tomorrow & Forever initiative of its 2020 Vision. This is the financial component to the NALC strategic plan that will provide the resources needed to turn this God-given Vision into a reality. Through this initiative, the NALC is asking pastors, congregations, mission districts, and individuals throughout the church to step out in faith and to help it to raise \$5 million above and beyond what it is already expecting to receive through regular giving over the next three years. This increased level of funding will not only strengthen the financial foundation of the church but will also enable a number of ministry and mission commitments we are making.

Elections: Mr. Jerry Roehr of Winnipeg, Manitoba, and the Rev. Theresa Jacobson of Thornville, Ohio, were elected to three-year terms on the Executive Council. The Rev. Dr. George Black of Foresthill, California, and the Rev. Ronald Hoyum of Poulsbo, Washington, were elected to three-year terms on the Court of Adjudication. Mrs. Lynnae Douglas of Export, Pennsylvania, the Rev. Dr. Stephane M. Kalonji of Rosenberg, Texas, and Mr. Richard Jansak of Hendersonville, North Carolina, were elected to five-year terms on the Executive Council. A devotion on the Mission Convocation theme, "A Great Cloud of Witnesses" (Hebrews 12:1-3) was delivered by Dr. David Luy, the new Associate Professor of Systematic Theology at the NALS. Dr. Luy's devotion highlighted the radical path to faithfulness, a call to endurance and perseverance, and a witness that points beyond what we see to what is real.

The 2023 budget was approved. The Mission Convocation approved a \$3.56 million budget for the ministry of the NALC. The 2023 unified budget combines the operating budget with the budgets of the church's designated funds – the Theological Education Fund (which includes the North American Lutheran Seminary), Great Commission Fund and Disaster Response Fund.

Per the NALC Constitution, the Executive Council also gave a report for the past year.


"But I trust in you, O Lord; I say, 'you are my God'. My times are in your hand;" Psalm 31:14-15

Bible Study Begins September 11 8:30 AM





FALL CHURCH CLEANUP



LWR SCHOOL, BABY AND PERSONAL CARE KIT ITEMS NEEDED

The following items are needed for LWR kits. Please have them to the church by September 16th. Put items in the quilt room downstairs. Thank you!

SCHOOL KITS:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approximately 8" X 10½"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2 1/2" eraser
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

BABY CARE KITS:

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies)
- Two long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, *or include a baby cap*
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- 2 or 3 bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 or 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars.
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

PERSONAL CARE KITS:

- One light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" & 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- 2 or 3 bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- One sturdy comb, remove packaging
- One metal nail clipper, remove packaging




